

At the community level, our work activates and strengthens safety nets such as the Bal Panchayats, Village Level Child Protection Committees and Ward Level Child Protection Committees so that at-risk children and their families need the help they need at the right

We are doing this project with the approval of Miracle Foundation India, the Central Government Social Security Department, the Child Welfare Committee, and the District Child Protection Unit.

At present, 166 children belonging to 107 villages in 13 districts are being educated in school, college, and various vocational educations in a safe environment with their parents and guardians.
